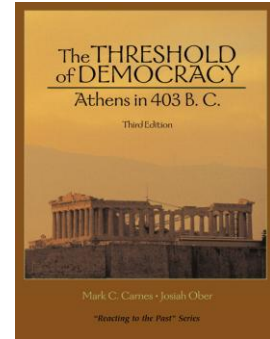
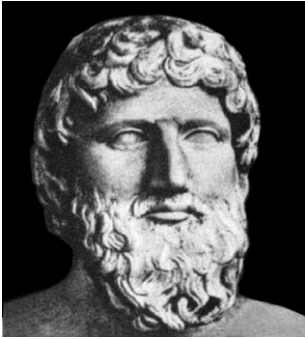


# HISTORY 1717

## REACTING TO THE PAST

This course uses historical simulation games to explore major historical ideas and texts. Student adopt historical roles and then work individually and in teams to relive pivotal moments and debates in history. We will play two full games in this course: *The Threshold of Democracy: Athens in 403 B.C.* and *Greenwich Village, 1913: Suffrage, Labor, and the New Woman*. Through these games, you will become intimately familiar with some core texts, including Plato's *Republic*. These games will give you the opportunity to imagine ways of thought that are sometimes familiar, and sometimes very different from our own.
