Early submissions are encouraged. As at previous conferences, selected papers will be published.

Using it as a guide, students should be able to quickly gain insights into the topics that span biographies, policies, institutional changes, diplomacy, and area studies. A comprehensive bibliography is included with books published after the last reference work, which covered books up to the early 1990s.
