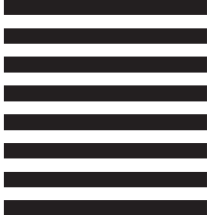

The Concurrent Program

The Concurrent Program offers a unique opportunity for students to get a head start on their graduate education while still an undergraduate student. Through HPU's Concurrent Program, qualified students may enroll in certain HPU graduate courses and earn both graduate and undergraduate credit simultaneously for the same course. Students benefit from this program with significant savings on tuition cost in addition to earning their master's degree in a shorter time.

Eligibility

- Enrolled at Hawai'i Pacific University as an undergraduate student
- Completed 100 semester hours of undergraduate credit
- Minimum GPA of 3.0

Application Process

- Consult with an HPU academic advisor in the Center for Graduate and Adult Services to discuss eligibility requirements

Master of Business Administration (MBA)

You can earn an MBA degree at HPU in as short a time as one year. Undergraduate students taking 12 semester credits at the graduate level can complete their MBA with only 10 additional courses.

The MA/GLSD, MA/HRM, and MA/OC programs each require 42 semester hours of credit, 12 hours of which may be earned through HPU's Concurrent Program. Graduate course prerequisites apply.

Master of Education in Secondary Education (M.Ed.) Five-Year Dual-Degree Program

Seniors who have earned 100 semester credits and who have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 can earn up to 12 dual undergraduate* and graduate credits in Education. Then, they can complete the M.Ed. degree in Secondary Education with only 10 additional graduate-level courses.
