Anthony Aalto and Mike Hinchey)

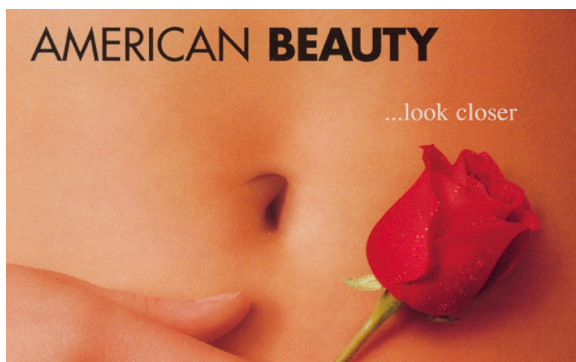
