Valedictory speakers at Hawai'i Pacific University are selected on the basis of grade point average and service to the community.

### Natalie Ann Ovena

#### Bachelor of Science in Environmental Science

Natalie Ann Ovena grew up in Beaverton, Oregon. She has roots in Hawai'i, with her family immigrating to the Hawaiian Islands from the Philippines. She discovered her connection to nature by hiking and learning to identify plants with her mom, and from a young age, Ovena knew she wanted to study the environment and learn how to protect it. She chose HPU to study the diversity of ecosystems in Hawai'i.

Working with the Blue Planet Foundation as their Policy Fellow, Ovena researched renewable energy, energy efficiency, and energy equity policies. Through community engagement, she helped build connections throughout Hawai'i, supporting Blue Planet's policy priorities. Embracing the opportunity to gain hands-on research experience, Ovena conducted research with HPU professor Dr. Carmella Vizza and partnered with the North Shore Community Land Trust to create a baseline profile of water quality parameters for Kalou fishpond and wetland taro patch to help inform restoration efforts.

Upon graduation, Ovena will continue research with Dr. Vizza through a two-year Hawai'i Sea Grant, beginning a new project documenting the fish species diversity and abundance to provide a baseline profile of the fish and help the North Shore Community Trust move forward with restoring Kalou as a traditional Hawaiian fishpond. Her longer-term career plan is to attend law school, studying environmental law and continuing to create change and help build a sustainable and equitable society.

#### Natalie Castillo O'Brien Master of Public Health

Natalie Castillo O'Brien's global journey has led her to diverse locations, culminating in her current residence in the enchanting country of England. When the global pandemic emerged in 2020, O'Brien, then an undergraduate healthcare administration major, immersed herself in understanding public health dynamics, sparking a profound interest in epidemiology. Pursuing a Master of Public Health (MPH) became her next logical step, and HPU offered the ideal program to refine her skills further. Despite relocating to England midway through her MPH studies, O'Brien found the HPU program fulfilling and valuable, demonstrating her commitment to overcoming logistical challenges.

Her master's capstone project, "Obsessive Compulsive Disorder (OCD) Health Seeking Dilemma," benefited significantly from her internship and volunteer work with HealthWatch England. The research underscored the complexity of the OCD health-seeking dilemma, emphasizing the urgent need for policies promoting mental health literacy across various settings. These initiatives, according to O'Brien, can facilitate early detection, diagnosis, and treatment for individuals grappling with OCD.

O'Brien attributes the shaping of her HPU education to guidance from professors, collaboration with peers, and hands-on experiences in the broader community. Looking ahead, she is determined to continue her academic journey, pursuing a Ph.D. in epidemiology.

### Academic Honors and Degree Conferral

Academic honors and degrees for this ceremony are calculated based upon grades earned prior to commencement. Final honors and degrees are conferred when the University Registrar posts the degree to the student's official transcript. Students graduating with HPU honors are wearing an honors sash as follows: Associate degree students graduating With Honors (with overall 3.4 – 4.0 HPA) receive a light blue sash; Bachelor's degree students graduating Summa Cum Laude (3.9 – 4.0 HPA), Magna Cum Laude (3.7 - 3.89 HPA), and Cum Laude (3.4 - 3.69 HPA) receive a silver sash; and Master's degree students graduating With Distinction (3.8 - 4.0 HPA) receive a gold sash.

#### **Honors Regalia**

Graduating students wearing honors regalia are members of local, national, or international honor societies. Honor cords, pins, or medallions identify students as members of one of the societies or programs listed below:

Alpha Chi: Blue and green cords. Membership is limited to the top 10% of juniors and seniors based on their HPU GPA and completion of 30 credits at HPU.

Alpha Epsilon Delta: Red and violet cords. Membership is limited to students with at least a 3.2 GPA in science courses and a major interest in medicine.

Alpha Lambda Delta: Red, gold, and white cords. Membership is limited to students in their first year at HPU who have achieved a GPA of 3.5.

Alpha Sigma Lambda: Maroon and gold cords. Membership is limited to undergraduate students at least 27 years of age who have a GPA of 3.2.

**Beta Beta:** Green and red cords. Membership is limited to students enrolled in biological sciences with a GPA of at least 3.0.

Chi Alpha Sigma: Gold medallions. Membership is limited to students in HPU athletics who have earned the equivalent of an intercollegiate varsity letter and have maintained a GPA of at least 3.4.

<u>Delta Mu Delta:</u> Purple and gold cords. Membership is limited to undergraduate and graduate students in the business degree program having a minimum GPA of 3.4 and 3.6 respectively.

Kappa Mu Epsilon: Lapel pins. Membership is limited to undergraduate students majoring in mathematics who have earned a GPA of 3.0 or better and rank in the upper 35% of their class.

<u>Lambda Pi Eta:</u> Red and white cords and lapel pin. Membership is limited to students majoring in communication who have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.25 for all communication courses.

Mu Kappa Tau: Royal blue cord and lapel pin. Membership is limited to undergraduate or graduate marketing students who have a cumulative GPA of 3.25 and undergraduate students who are either in the top 10% of their junior class or top 20% of their senior class.

Phi Alpha: Single gold cord.

Membership is limited to students enrolled in the social work degree program who have an overall cumulative GPA of 3.0 and a GPA of 3.25 in social work courses.

<u>Phi Alpha Theta:</u> Lapel pins and sashes. Membership is limited to students majoring in history ranking in the top 35% of their class with a GPA of at least 3.1 in history classes.

Pi Alpha Alpha: Lapel pin and blue and gold cords. Membership is limited to students in disciplines related to public service, such as public administration and criminal justice with a cumulative GPA of 3.5 for undergraduates and 3.7 for graduate students.

Pi Sigma Alpha: Medallion.

Membership is limited to students majoring in or having taken at least six upper-division credits in political science, with a cumulative GPA of 3.2.

<u>Psi Chi:</u> Blue and silver cords. Membership is limited to students in psychology who have a cumulative GPA of 3.45 and rank in the top 35% of their class.

<u>Sigma Delta Pi:</u> Lapel pins. Membership is limited to students studying Spanish language and culture who have a GPA of 3.0 in their Spanish courses and rank in the top 35% of their class.

<u>Sigma Tau Delta:</u> Red and black cords. Membership is limited to students majoring in English or minoring in writing, film Studies, or literature who have a cumulative GPA of 3.44.

Sigma Theta Tau: Orchid and white cords. Membership is limited to nursing students who have a GPA of 3.0 (3.5 for graduate students) and are of junior or senior status with a ranking in the highest 35% of the nursing class.

<u>Upsilon Pi Epsilon:</u> Maroon and white cords and lapel pin. Membership is limited to students in the study of information systems, computer science, and computer information systems who have a GPA of 3.0 for undergraduate students or a 3.5 for graduate students.

<u>University Scholar:</u> Gold-ribboned honors medallion signifies a University Scholar who has maintained at least a 3.4 GPA in addition to completing nine honors-designated courses in their degree program, participated in extracurricular activities, and completed a senior presentation.

#### **Academic Regalia**

Graduates and faculty participating in HPU's graduation ceremonies wear traditional academic attire. Associate and bachelor's degree candidates wear royal blue gowns with straight sleeves. Master's degree candidates wear royal blue gowns with oblong sleeves and hoods with colors that represent their degree programs. Doctoral candidates wear royal blue gowns with bell-shaped sleeves, including three velvet bars, blue velvet panels down the front with the university logo, blue velvet tam, and hoods with the colors that represent their degree program. Faculty may wear the regalia representing the university from which they received their terminal degree. At HPU, graduates may also wear lei in addition to honors cords, sashes and stoles. Tassel colors represent the various degree programs. They include:
