General Education Courses	 Priority admission will be given to applicants with only one outstanding general education at the start of the Nursing program. IF you have more than 4 outstanding general education courses, you will need special approval to start the nursing program and may be asked to defer your entrance. Recommendations	 Two professional letters of reference such as from employers, faculty and other professional contacts. Personal letters of reference from family members or friends are not acceptable. Letters must be sent directly from the reference. The applicant will provide the references' contact information in the HPU Nursing application, the computer will send an email to the contact to complete. The Accident

Ms. Kaeo was driving down Nalani Street crossing Pueo Street when another car almost hit her causing her to drive into a tree. Ms. Kaeo and her two young children were injured and taken to the hospital.

NURSING: at the hospital the nurse assesses, plans, and implements care to the patients alongside the doctor. Ms. Kaeo broke her hip, requiring surgery and a short hospital stay. Ms. Kaeo's son sustained head injuries from an improper car seat requiring neurological observation. Ms. Kaeo's daughter, Pua, was not injured.

SOCIAL WORK: They discover that Ms. Kaeo is uninsured and lacking in child care while she remains in the hospital. The Social Worker provides trauma counseling and connects Ms. Kaeo with community resources to address her hospital bills and need for child care.

PUBLIC HEALTH: notices that that particular intersection has had over 40 accidents in 10 years. The public health professional analyzes the accident reports, community concerns, street signs, speed limit and discovers several concerns. The intersection has increased traffic due to a new development warranting new street signs for a 4-way stop intersection. Nalani Street also had overgrown trees and vegetation limiting the drivers' sightline of cross traffic at the intersection. Also Ms. Kaeo's 3 year old was in a booster seat instead of the required car seat.
