Programs that are not open to exchange students

Exchange students are <u>restricted from enrolment</u> into some subjects. In particular Medicine, Dentistry, Physiotherapy, some subjects within Biomedical & Veterinary Sciences, and some subjects within the School of Education.

Students cannot apply for MD, DS, ML, PC, PS, RH, TV subjects.

Exchange students cannot take Honours subjects, some External or Limited mode subjects are restricted (US Financial Aid students should check that subject choices will not affect your funding options) and Block subjects with inappropriate dates. If unsure, you may select the subject and we will check if you are able to take it.

Are subjects available online?	Use the online Study Finder to search for subjects
Are exchange students guaranteed for approval in their chosen subjects?	No, exchange students are accepted individually by each Faculty depending on prerequisites and space available.

ACCOMMODATION











Is on-campus housing available?	Yes, there are catered and self-catered accommodation options available. NOTE: on-campus accommodation is limited; students should submit applications as soon as possible after receiving an offer.

Is accommodation guaranteed for exchange students?	No, students are advised to submit their accommodation application as soon as possible. JCU can help students find off-campus accommodation if needed. *on campus accommodation is now available in Cairns.
Application procedures for accommodation	Students can apply online as soon they have received their offer letters. Students will need to provide their Confirmation of Enrolment certificate (CoE) to accept accommodation offers.
When should accommodation applications be submitted?	For Semester One (Teaching Period One): from August For Semester Two (Teaching Period Two): from April
	A \$55 non-refundable application fee applies.
Is there assistance in finding off- campus accommodation?	Yes, JCU's Accommodation Service maintains a database of off- campus accommodation and provides advice about renting privately
MEDICAL INSURANCE	
Are exchange students required to purchase a compulsory plan?	It is a condition of the student visa that a student is covered by a recognised private health insurer for the duration of their studies.
	JCU organises Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for students with <u>Allianz Global Assistance</u> .
	Norwegian and Belgium students are not required to take out OSHC.
How much does OSHC cost?	Approx. AU\$330 per semester and AU\$562 for full year students (depending on which semester the student starts in).
	Note: Above estimates outlines the current 2017 rate and may slightly vary depending on which semester period students commence their studies. Rates are subject to change. Additional charges apply if student elects to bring a partner or family members for all or part of their exchange experience.
